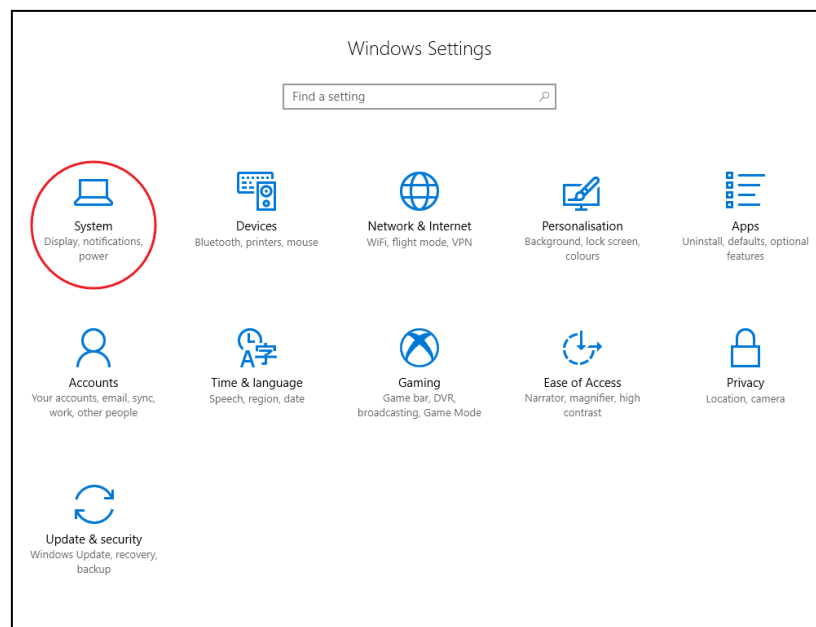


Enabling Windows 10 Scaling for FirstRate5

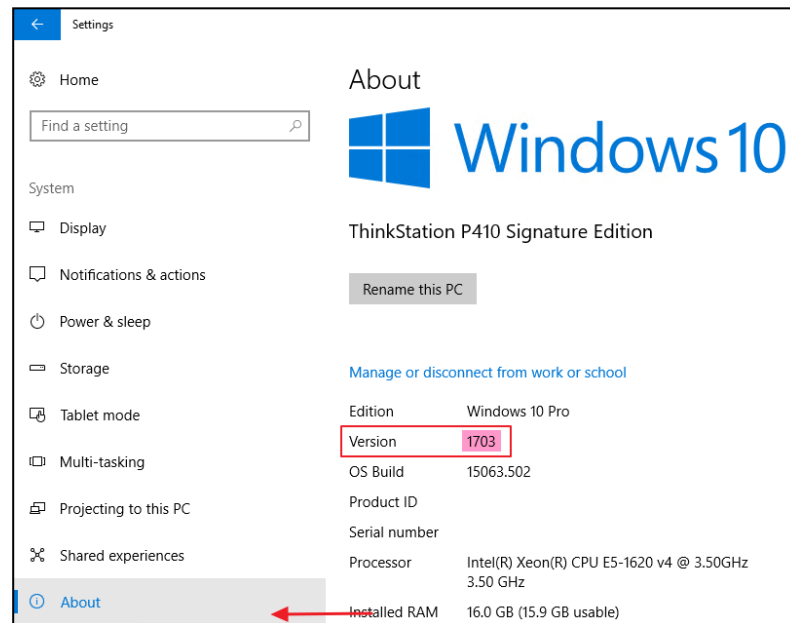
Users that have Windows 10 version 1703 or greater installed on their computers have the ability to enable Windows 10 scaling for FirstRate5. Applying this scaling may result in FirstRate5 displaying better on high resolution screens.

The following instructions explain how to check the version of Windows 10 currently installed on your computer and how to apply Windows 10 scaling.

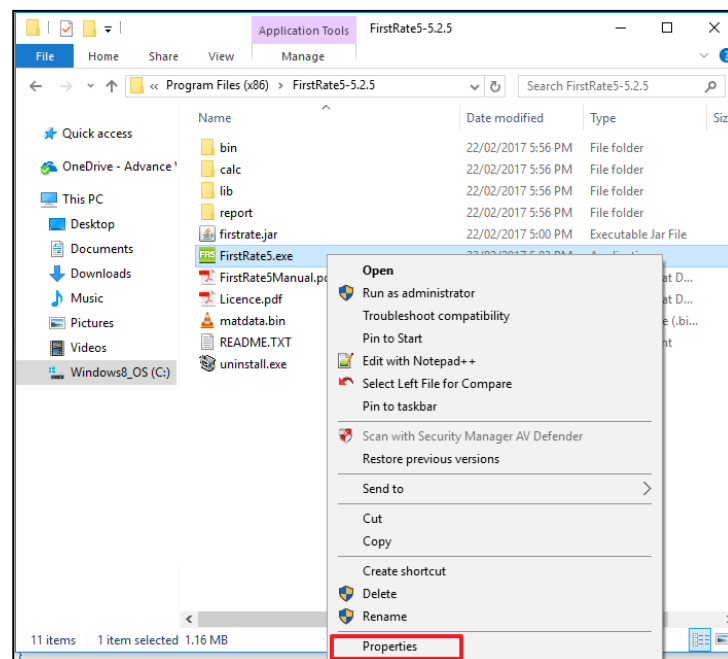
1. To check the version of Windows 10 installed go to **System** and click on the **About** tab.



Once you confirm you have version 1703 or greater you can proceed to step two to enable scaling.

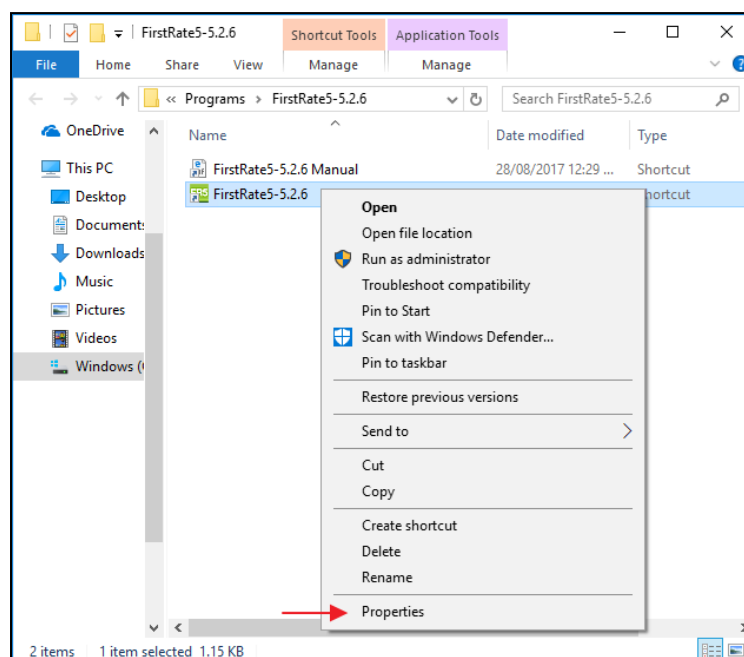
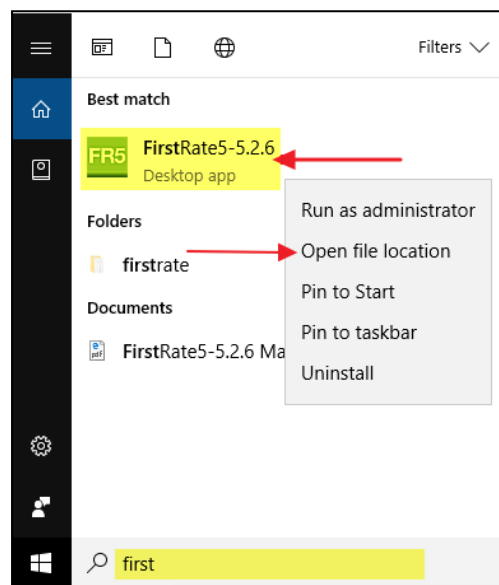


2. Navigate to the location where FirstRate5 has been installed and right click on the **.exe** file and select **Properties**

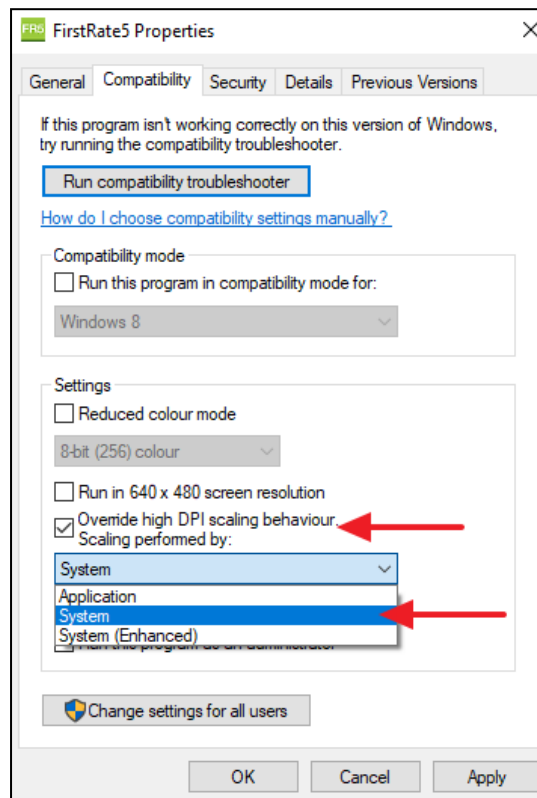


Alternatively - If the installation location is unknown, do the following:

- a. Search for the application using the start menu
- b. Once the application has been found, hover over FirstRate5, right click and then select 'Open file location'
- c. Proceed with the instructions above



3. Navigate to the Compatibility tab and perform the following: –
 - a. Tick the checkbox “Override high DPI scaling behaviour.”
 - b. Select **System** from the drop down list
 - c. Click ‘Apply’ and then start FirstRate5 as normal



In the future, if you no longer want Windows 10 scaling, simply uncheck the box “Override high DPI acting behaviour”.
